During this interactive presentation, participants will view the documentary *Resilience: The Biology of Stress & the Science of Hope* which delves into the science of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs). The documentary reveals how toxic stress, and trauma can impact a child's ability to learn, can lead to depression, put them at greater risk for disease, homelessness, substance use, prison time and lower life expectancy in adulthood.
